Her research focuses on deliberative and participatory democracy and democratic governance and climate change. She has served on the advisory boards of Ireland's first Citizens' Assembly 'We the Citizens' (2011), Ireland's Constitutional Convention (2012-2014). She was a co-PI on the EPA funded Imagining 2050 project.</p>	<p><b>Dr Alexandra Reves</b> is a Senior Postdoctoral Researcher in MaREI the SFI Research Centre for Energy, Climate and Marine. She is a practiced academic with expertise in Human Geography and Community Development. Her research work with the Imagining2050 project has focused on democratic innovations, co-creation, leveraging collective imaginations, and engagement with communities on issues linked to climate action.</p>
